TrustID Personal Software certificates are issued under the publicly trusted IdenTrust TrustID program and are used by individuals who wish to secure email and digitally sign documents.

This certificate is stored in your browser certificate store on your local PC or laptop.

### Affiliated Programs

Because TrustID certificates are publicly trusted, affiliated programs are not applicable. Anyone can trust your signature or email secured by your TrustID Personal Software certificate.

<b>Identity Authentication Method:</b>	Your identity is verified by IdenTrust via an automated process
<b>Identity Proofing Requirements:</b>	Provide personally identifying information
<b>Forms Packet Required:</b>	No - You do not need to submit forms for this certificate type
<b>Trust Model:</b>	This certificate is publicly trusted
<b>Assurance Level:</b>	Basic Assurance
<b>Certificate Type:</b>	This is an individual certificate that it is issued to you
<b>Validity Periods:</b>	Available in a one (1) year validity period
